## SELECTION OF STARTERS FROM GUJARAT

**Farsan** - Dhokla, Khandavi, Phaphada, Dhabeli

First course is dedicated to Vikram Sarabhai, a scientist, an innovator and a father of Indian space programme. Establishment of ISRO on 15<sup>th</sup> August 1969 was one of his greatest achievements and contributions to modern India. Vikram Sarabhai was able to set up India's first rocket launching station in Thumba where India launched its first satellite Aryabhata in space.

## FLAVOURS FROM SOUTHERN COAST

**Dakshin Ke Sawad** - Chicken Chukka, Meen Pollichattu, Kunni Paniyaram

Second course dedicated to Professor C.V. Raman. He is remembered for his contribution to physics for which he received the Noble Prize in 1928. He has shown change in the wave length of light that occurs when a light beam is deflected by molecules, and this analysis has been one of the few techniques which can provide key information in detailing the chemical composition and the structure of the investigated materials. Application of Raman's effect is seen in geology, material science, pharmaceutical industry, nuclear and forensic science disciplines.

## FESTIVE SECRETS FROM NORTH INDIAN KITCHENS

**Khana Naush Farmayen** - Aloo Gosht, Murgh Achari Korma, Paneer lababdar

Third course pays a tribute to Birbal Sahani, a great visionary, a teacher, a researcher, a dreamer and also the first founder of the palaeobotanical research in India. He is being credited with the study of fossil plants in India and internationally. Amongst a large number of fossil plants described by him from Rajmahal Hills of Bihar, his most remarkable discovery was a new group of fossil gymnosperms that were named Pentoxylae. He was also the founder of Institute of Palaeobotany in Lucknow that was later renamed as Birbal Sahani Institute of Palaeobotany.

## BENGALI SWEETS

**Bangla Mishti Mishti** - Mango Ras, Warm Chocolate, Jaggery Ice Cream

Fourth course is dedicated to Sir Jagadish Chandra Bose, one of the most prominent first Indian scientists who proved by experimentation that animals and plants share much in common. He demonstrated that plants are sensitive to heat, cold, light, noise and other external stimuli. Bose contrived a very sophisticated instrument called Crescograph which could record and observe the minute responses caused by external stimulants. He also discovered Coehere which is needed to detect radio waves for successful transmission.
